TILBURY WIN THE ISTHMIAN LEAGUE CUP

Ryman Division One North side Tilbury beat Harrow Borough 2-0 at Staines Town on Wednesday evening to win this season's League Cup Final.

The game had started very evenly with both sides trying to take control of the game in the opening ten minutes. As the game went on Harrow Borough looked dangerous with their pacey forwards and wide men always looking to get behind the Tilbury defence. Tilbury who had beaten three Premier Division sides en-route to the Final played some nice passing football whilst their defence was always on hand to deal with Harrow's attacks.

The first goal came after 30 minutes as Tilbury attacked down their right hand side, a pin point cross came in which was superbly headed in by Chris Stowe. Harrow Borough went searching for the equaliser but Tilbury's defence continued to keep the door shut with commanding displays both in the air and on the ground which took them into half time with a 1-0 lead.

Early in the second half Tilbury extended their lead with Chris Stowe scoring his second goal of the game after 51 minutes. Harrow were running out ideas to break down the resolute Tilbury defence which stood up firm all evening. A lifeline was given to Harrow after 81 minutes when they were awarded a penalty, but Lee Hall blazed his attempt high

and wide to the left of the goal leaving Tilbury to see out the game for the remaining minutes.

As the full time whistle went there were scenes of jubilation with Tilbury celebrating a stunning achievement, before they were presented with the Cup by League Chairman Alan Turvey.

WEEKEND REVIEW

Good Friday/Easter Saturday

Only two issues were settled in the Good Friday/Easter Saturday segment of the holiday fixtures, confirmed relegation spots for Ramsgate in the Premier Division, after their 2-0 home loss to Harrow Borough, and for Witham Town in Division One North after they went down 2-1 at home to Thamesmead Town.

In the Premier Division on Friday afternoon, both Tooting & Mitcham United, at home to Tonbridge Angels, and Staines Town, entertaining AFC Hornchurch, scored in the dying moments to rescue 2-2 draws. On Saturday, Heybridge Swifts won the relegation battle at home to Margate 3-2, while Harlow slipped up 1-0 at home to Horsham. The result of the day was at the Perry's Crabble, where Dover Athletic were presented with the League Championship trophy, and promptly lost 2-1 to Boreham Wood. Of the other teams in trouble, Hendon defeated Maidstone United 2-0 at Earlsmead, but Hastings United, 2-0 at home to Sutton United, and Ashford Town (Middlesex) 1-0 at Canvey Island, lost. Carshalton Athletic beat Billericay Town 3-1 at the War Memorial Stadium and it ended goalless at Grosvenor Vale, where Wealdstone entertained Dartford.

The Division One North title race is down to three runners, with East Thurrock United, leading Aveley on goal difference after they both won on Saturday, the Rocks 5-0 at home to Cheshunt, the Millers 2-0 at home to Redbridge. Brentwood Town are six points behind, but ended Wingate & Finchley's playoff hopes with a 3-0 home win. Waltham Abbey, despite their 2-2 draw at Great Wakering Rovers are pretty secure in fourth place. The last playoff spot rests between Northwood, who drew 1-1 at Chatham Town, and Concord Rangers, 5-0 winners at Waltham Forest. The Essex club are two points behind the Woods, but have a game in hand and a six-goal advantage in goal-difference. Enfield Town beat League Cup-winners Tilbury 1-0 at the Goldsdown Ground, while Maldon Town won 2-0 at Hillingdon Borough. The matches between Potters Bar Town and Ilford and Ware and Leyton both ended 1-1.

In Division One South, Friday's game at Whyteleafe went the way of visitors Leatherhead, 2-0 the score. On Saturday, leaders Kingstonian kept up their three-point advantage over Cray Wanderers with a 2-1 win at Burgess Hill Town, while the Wands were beating Walton Casuals 3-0 at Hayes Lane. Fleet Town hung on to third place despite their 1-0 home defeat at the hands of struggling Whitstable Town, so Worthing and Metropolitan Police cut the deficit to a single point with victories, the Rebels beating Merstham 4-2 at the A2B Stadium, and the Blues winning 2-1 at Chipstead, leaving the Chips in the bottom. Crowborough's 32nd League defeat of the season was by the

minimum, a solitary second half goal being enough for Croydon Athletic. Sittingbourne, at home to Godalming Town, and Eastbourne Town, at Walton & Hersham, both also won 1–0, and the Brickies – four points Metropolitan Police – are the only other team in the playoff picture. Corinthian–Casuals ensured their safety with a 5–1 win at Ashford Town, but there were no goals at Champion Hill, where Dulwich Hamlet played Folkestone Invicta.

Easter Monday

Premier Division champions Dover Athletic returned to winning ways with 2–0 victory at Maidstone United, the only one of the top five to win. Staines Town were surprised at 2–0 at Ashford Town (Middlesex), while Tonbridge Angels conceded two late goals again to draw 3–3 at Hastings United and Sutton United and Carshalton Athletic shared two goals at Gander Green Lane. Margate boosted their survival hopes by beating Ramsgate 1–0, but Heybridge Swifts' 2–0 loss at Billericay Town sees their bottom-four finish confirmed and Harlow Town's 3–1 defeat at Billericay leaves them in deep trouble. Dartford beat Canvey Island 4–0 at Princes Park, Wealdstone won 3–0 at Harrow Borough, while Tooting & Mitcham United's visit to Horsham ended goalless.

In Division One North, the top two both won, Aveley 2–0 at Leyton, and East Thurrock United 1–0 at Tilbury. Brentwood Town equalised in the last minute to get a 1–1 draw at Redbridge, leaving the door open for Waltham Abbey, 1–0 winners at home to Enfield Town, to snatch third place. Concord Rangers' 4–0 victory over Great Wakering Rovers lifts them into fifth place, ahead of Northwood on goal difference, but the Woods were not due to play until Tuesday night – against doomed Hillingdon Borough. Witham Town's 1–0 victory at Maldon Town has come too late to save them from a bottom-two finish, but Ilford moved further away from the bottom with a 1–0 victory over 20th–placed Waltham Forest. Wingate & Finchley's 2–1 victory over Potters Bar Town comes too late for them to make a playoff charge, while Ware drew 3–3 at Cheshunt and there were no goals at Thamesmead Town, where Chatham Town were the visitors.

The match of the day in Division One South all but decided the title race as Kingstonian beat Cray Wanderers 2–0. Worthing won 4–2 at Eastbourne Town to move to within three points of the Wands, but Fleet Town also lost ground with a 1–1 draw at Godalming Town. A three-goal win for Metropolitan Police on

Tuesday night could lift them into third place and leave Sittingbourne, who were denied victory at Whitstable Town by a last-minute goal, with an almost impossible task to reach the playoffs. At the bottom, Crowborough Athletic's misery continued with a 4–1 home defeat at the hands of Burgess Hill Town, who moved four points clear of the bottom two with their victory. Chipstead picked up a point from a goalless draw at Merstham, while Walton Casuals also collected three vital points beating Walton & Hersham 1–0 at home. Folkestone Invicta beat Ashford Town 1–0 at the Buzzlines Stadium and Dulwich Hamlet won 3–0 at Leatherhead.

Premier Division

Good Friday/Easter Saturday

Goals from Sean Sonner and Mario Noto, either side of strike from Lassana Sidibe, gave Boreham Wood a shock 2–1 victory at Dover Athletic. Staines Town set a new club record with a seventh straight Ryman League draw, brothers Howard and Jake Newton netting for the Swans, opening and closing the scoring against AFC Hornchurch, for whom Dean Green scored twice. It was also the first time in more than 30 years that two brothers had scored in the same game for Staines. The other Good Friday fixture was even more dramatic as Jamie Cade and Paul Booth seemed to have given Tonbridge Angels the points at Tooting & Mitcham United, only for Andrew Howell and Dean McDonald, a penalty, to score in the last five minutes, to snatch a point for the Terrors.

Steve Dobinson, for Canvey Island at home to Ashford Town (Middlesex), and Gary Charman, for Horsham at Harlow Town, scored the only goals of their matches, while two Jamie Busby penalties were enough for Hendon to see off Maidstone United at Harrow Borough. For Borough, there was also a 2–0 win, with their goals at Ramsgate coming from Gary Noel and Dwaine Clarke. In the big relegation battle at Scraley Road, Heybridge Swifts led through Steve Bourne, but Margate hit back with goals from James Gregory and Ryan Peters. Swifts won it with a pair of goals from Ben Codling in the final ten minutes.

Laurent Hamici and Karim El-Salahi kept up Sutton's playoff hopes, their goals defeating Hastings United at the Pilot Field, while the Us neighbours, Carshalton Athletic, were winning 3–1 at home to Billericay Town, all the goals coming the second half. Charlie Ide gave the Robins the lead, only for Leon Hunter to equalise. But Jamie England and Richard Jolly penalty sealed the points for Carshalton.

Wealdstone and Dartford dented each other's playoff hopes with a goalless draw at Grosvenor Vale.

Easter Monday

Dover Athletic got second-half goals from Jonathan Wallis and James Rogers as they won 2–0 at Maidstone United. Ricky Wellard and Gavin Smith scored as Ashford Town (Middlesex) won by a similar score at home to Staines Town. There was a thriller at Longmead Stadium, where Tonbridge Angels and Hastings United shared six goals. Paul Booth's opener for the Angels was cancelled out by Sam Adams, but Carl Rook looked to have won with his goal on the stroke of half-time. Frankie Sawyer levelled it with two minutes to go, only for Rook to strike again a minute later. But, in stoppage time Rhys Whyborne made it 3–3. At Gander Green Lane, Gavin McCullum looked to have given Sutton United all three points, but Charlie Ide equalised for Carshalton Athletic in the final minute.

Greg Ngoyi's hat-trick was enough for Wealdstone to claim borough bragging rights after they beat Harrow Borough 3–0 at Earlsmead. Two Paul Shave goals ended Billericay's relegation worries as they saw off Heybridge Swifts at New Lodge, while Daniel Young's late goal gave Margate all three points at home to doomed Ramsgate.

At Bridge Avenue, Tom Bruno gave visiting Harlow Town the lead against AFC Hornchurch. But the Urchins hit back with goals from Mervyn Abraham, Dean Green and Ross Wall to win 3–1. Dartford scored three times in 11 second half minutes to complete their 4–0 win over Canvey Island. Lee Noble gave the Darts a first-half lead before Adam Flanagan, a penalty, Rob Haworth and Ryan Hayes put the game beyond the Gulls' reach. Horsham and Tooting & Mitcham United played out a goalless stalemate at Worthing.

The other match involving a Premier Division side was the Middlesex Senior Cup, but Hendon lost 2–0 to AFC Hayes, Victor Osubu, early, and Dean Papali, in stoppage time, scoring.

Good Friday/Easter Saturday

Kris Newby, Kurt Smith and Martin Tuohy were all on target in the first half for East Thurrock United as they crushed Cheshunt 5–0. Tuohy got a second and Elliot Gresham rounded off the scoring in the second half. Two Junior Dodson goals were enough for Aveley to keep

up the pressure on the Rocks as the Millers beat Redbridge 2–0 at the Mill Field. And it was a good day for the top three as Brentwood Town got goals from Steve King, Danny Carroll and Darren Blewitt to see off Wingate & Finchley 3–0. Marc Sontag and a Scott Keys own goal gave Waltham Abbey a two-goal half-time lead at Great Wakering Rovers, but the home grabbed a point courtesy of goals from Gary Ogilvie and Billy Johnson. Northwood also had to settle for an away point, Rob Ursell scoring late on to cancel out Bryon Walker's goal for Chatham Town.

Hillingdon Borough lost for the 32nd time in the Ryman League when Joel Barnett netted twice for visiting Maldon Town, while Witham Town will join Borough in the bottom two after Josh Goodey's early goal was cancelled out by one from Thamesmead Town's Rikki Cable, and Scott Mulholland got the Thamesmead winner. Ilford collected a point at Potters Bar Town, having taken a second-half lead through Troy Hewitt. Harrison Tague replied for the Scholars. It was a similar tale at Wodson Park, where Ware's Kaan Fehmi gave them the lead against Leyton, only for Robert Carter to rescue a point. And Ellis Remy scored the only goal for Enfield Town as they won 1–0 at home Tilbury.

Easter Monday

Matt Lovell's second-half goal was enough for leaders East Thurrock United to win 1–0 at Tilbury, while Petrit Elbi and Chris Thomas were on target for second-placed Aveley as they won 2–0 at Leyton. At Oakside, Hakeem Araba gave Redbridge a first-half advantage against third-placed Brentwood Town. But Sam Higgins snatched a point in the final minute.

There were no goals at Thamesmead Town, where Chatham Town were the visitors. But one goal was enough for Ilford, Anton Trice scoring in the final minutes at home to Waltham Forest, Witham Town – Steve Joyce netting after just three minutes at Maldon Town – and Waltham Abbey at home to Enfield Town, where Denny Webb was again a last-minute hero.

Bradley Harrison netted a hat-trick for Cheshunt at home to Ware, equalising thrice, after the visitors had led through Kai Ramshaw, twice and Joe Stevens. There was no such drama at Thames Road, where Concord Rangers got goals from Yohance Lewis, Elliot Buchanan, Danny Heale and Nicky Cowley, all in the first 35 minutes, to win 4–0. And two Chris Chase goals, early and

late, were enough for Wingate & Finchley to see off Potters Bar Town 2–1 at the Abrahams Stadium. Jean Dossou had equalised for the Scholars.

Good Friday/Easter Saturday

On Friday afternoon, Jason Turley and Kev Terry scored for Leatherhead on their visit to Whyteleafe, who are now just four points clear of the relegation zone. Crowborough are already doomed and lost again, to Joe Howe's goal for Croydon Athletic, while Chipstead remain in the drop zone after Jordan Kiffin's opener at home to Metropolitan Police was matched by a strike by Nick Humphrey and beaten by another from Liam Baitup. Burgess Hill Town also lost 2–1 at home to a promotion hopeful, Bobby Traynor scoring twice for leaders Kingstonian. Luke Gedling scored for the Hillians to make it 1–1. The big winners were Corinthian–Casuals, who had five different scorers in their 5–1 win at Ashford Town. Joe McNerney, Sam Robinson, Saheed Sankoh, Jamal Carr and Richard Brightwell were the marksmen, the last four goals coming in the final 22 minutes. It was 3–0 when Elliot Braithwaite notched for the Nuts & Bolts.

Cray Wanderers got another two goals from Lewis Wood and one from Colin Lockett as they won 3–0 at home to Walton Casuals, while another team in the playoff positions, Worthing, scored four at home Merstham. Jamie Brotherton gave the Rebels the lead, but Merstham were ahead at half-time after Kwabena Agyei and Dean Gunner netted. Mickey Demetriou restored parity and Ross Treleaven and Paul Kennett won it late for Worthing. David Corey of Whitstable Town scored the only goal in the final minute to all but end Fleet Town's title hopes. Sittingbourne still have faint hopes of making the playoffs after Sam DaBolla's goal settled their contest against Godalming Town at the Bourne Stadium. A solitary goal from Ethan Strevett on the stroke of half-time, gave Eastbourne Town all three points at Walton & Hersham, but neither Dulwich Hamlet nor Folkestone Invicta could break the deadlock at Champion Hill.

Easter Monday

Leaders Kingstonian all but wrapped up the title after goals from Simon Huckle and Max Hustwick gave them a 2–0 victory over nearest rivals Cray Wanderers. Worthing trailed early to a Jamie Salvidge goal at The Saffrons. But Michael Demetriou equalised and Chris O'Flaherty gave them a half-time lead. Danny

Simmonds equalised for Eastbourne Town early in the second half, but Jamie Brotherton and Lee Farrell added goals for the Rebels. Mark Anderson scored after four minutes for Fleet Town at Godalming Town, but they had to settle for a point after an own goal from Michael Douglas levelled matters ten minutes later.

Another Easter hat-trick hero was Croydon Athletic's Ben Godfrey at Corinthian–Casuals. Further goals from Shabazz Baidoo and Karl Murray completed a 5–0 win. It was almost as conclusive at Crowborough Athletic, where Danny Gainsford, Wesley Tate (against his former club) and Steve Harper, twice, gave Burgess Hill Town a 4–1 win. David Soutar was on target for the Crows. Daniel Francis and Junior Kaffo – twice – netted for Dulwich Hamlet in their 3–0 win at Leatherhead.

Jacob Arnold-Smith was Folkestone Invicta's match-winner at home to Ashford Town, while Anthony Gale also scored the only goal in Walton Casuals' home win against Walton & Hersham. There was a dramatic finish at Whitstable Town, where the Oysterman grabbed a point with Dave Cory's last-minute goal. It denied Sittingbourne all three points, after they had led for 74 minutes through Hicham Akhazzan. But there were no goals at Moatside when Chipstead visited Merstham.

Ryman Youth League

Having drawn with each other a week ago, it was more bad news for the top two clubs – Croydon Athletic and Lewes – in the South East Division of the Ryman Youth League this week. On Monday evening second placed Lewes lost 3-1 at Worthing, with Danny Mobsby scoring two of the goals for the home team. Then at the end of the week, top placed Croydon Athletic completed their League programmes with a single goal defeat at Maidstone United – Tom Parkinson scoring the all important winner after an hour's play.

With Tonbridge Angels recording a 3-0 home win on Monday evening against Horsham, and Worthing a second 3-1 victory of the week on Thursday against Burgess Hill Town, the table has changed so that Tonbridge Angels and Worthing are now in second and third places respectively, just three points behind Croydon Athletic, but with four and two games to play as the leaders have finished their programme. Now down to fourth spot are Lewes, five points behind Croydon with four games remaining.

Elsewhere in the Division, Burgess Hill Town had beaten Whyteleafe 3-0 at the start of the

week, whilst the two basement clubs, Horsham YMCA and Horsham met in front of the season's biggest Youth League attendance of the season – 120 watched Horsham win the local derby 2-0.

No change at the top of the North West Division, as leaders Staines Town and challengers AFC Wimbledon were involved in Cup action. Woking retained third spot with a 2-0 victory at Kingstonian, whilst Godalming Town won their second match of the season with a 2-1 home won against Walton & Hersham. In the final match in this Division, Hampton & Richmond Borough shared six goals and the points with Tooting & Mitcham United on Thursday evening.

In the Isthmian Youth Cup quarter-final, visitors Staines Town won the local derby 2-1 at Ashford Town (Middx) – a match watched

by a crowd of 103, to join Boreham Wood min the semi-finals.
